Heather Simkins:

It's tick season: ID cards for ticks/bugs are available if people want them for their respective organizations/sites

WIC will be launching/offering SDF- Silver diamine fluoride treatments at the WIC clinic. (Treatment stops plaque/decay from worsening, prevents cavities, etc). Typically done with infants/young children, but adults can absolutely opt to do so!

WIC clinic has opened in Alburgh! This will be available quarterly (the next in July) at the Municipal Offices.

No updates of Hepatitis A outbreak (reports of confirmed HEP A in NH and VT)...there isn't a public update as of yet, but Heather will be happy to provide updates as they come.



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Bonnie Massey-Preston/Becky Gadue:

Head Start is in full recruitment mode: recruiting for St. Albans and Swanton HS 8:30-2:30 classrooms, as well as outreach for the islands.

Mary Pickener:

VDH and UVM recruiting 12-25 year olds to complete surveys around alcohol, tobacco, prescription drugs. Can get up to \$50 in gift cards, (various amounts)

HRSA (Rural Services Administration) grant renewal: prevention and wrap-around services. Addressing opiate use, treatment OR recovery in the region. \$300,000 for 3 years.

Jen Severence:

Capacity work (child care): has met with new prospects for child care around the region. Enosburgh child care initiative: a meeting was held in Enosburg last week looking at issues around child care in Enosburgh. Michelle Trayah was able to bring statistics around child care in the region, Melissa Riegel-Garrett brought perspective of licensing, and Jen brought resources for potential child care openings. She continues to increase supports for child care providers to raise/maintain STARS ratings and offer career development options.

Improve Foster care/recruitment for the community: collaboration for Kids Fest

Services are available for anyone who needs advice around professional development (Fundamentals Training to further career development). Can help navigate resources (financial to pay for college courses) and coordinate non-credit trainings.

**Fundamentals Trainings (45 introductory trainings who are new to working in home/center based-requirement for licensing; medication training, specialized care, etc.): they are offered 4 times a year.

Trainings-social emotional development of toddlers and trauma-informed practice

Reflective Practice for providers and mentors in programs (June, 2019)

Next Fundamentals Training: September 2019.

Will continue to discuss opportunities for parent/provider trainings in the region (work with council)

Hunger Council: John Gorton-Sheldon Food Shelf, Robin Way-CIDER Executive Director, Tony Auriemma-Northwest Family Foods are presenting on transportation barriers to food access at the Vermont Foodbank Conference on May 3rd from 7:30-4:00 in Killington, VT. Looking for ideas from other regions about how people are combating barriers to food access.

Natalie Glenn and Michelle are sitting on the planning committee for the Formidable Fours: four biggest barriers to access employment in the region: child care, substance use, housing, transportation.

Child care summit will be taking place on Monday May 6th from 2:00-4:00 at City Hall Legislators and business leaders are invited!

Defining family engagement, looking at how the whole state of VT considers this term)...we can't educate children without the family taking a primary role in that!
