# **Overview for Potential Implementation Sites**

<u>Dr. Lori Meyer</u> from the University of Vermont leads **The Vermont Early MTSS-123 Project** in collaboration with <u>Building Bright Futures</u>, coaches from Pyramid 802 PLUS, the <u>Pyramid Model Consortium</u>, and <u>Strengthening Families</u> trainers Maureen Durning and Jane Zink. In the title, "123" represents essential project features. That is, piloting a regional support team model that will engage and enhance **one** Vermont early childhood system by supporting the adoption and implementation of **two** social and emotional frameworks (Pyramid Model and Strengthening Families<sup>™</sup>) with **three** core groups at the heart of all activities – children, families, and early childhood practitioners.

Major activities of this project include: Piloting regional support teams, providing assistance to pilot regions to build local capacity, and developing a statewide plan for scaling-up and sustaining implementation of the two frameworks. Vermont's Preschool Development Grant provides funding for this work through February 2021.

# **Implementation Sites**

Regional Leadership Teams will identify one to two programs¹ as implementation sites. Each implementation site will be provided with a coach. The primary goal of coaches is to support sites in implementing The Pyramid Model and Strengthening Families innovations with high fidelity. Coaches are prepared to work with site leadership to determine what stage of implementation they are in for the two innovations and build support around site-specific needs. Implementation site participants will be invited to contribute their experiences and perspectives at key moments during the project to assist developing a statewide plan for scaling-up and sustaining Early MTSS and the two innovations.
